The Oregon Health Authority is in the process of developing the first Adult Suicide Intervention and Prevention Plan (ASIPP). There has been a youth plan since 2015, however the adult plan is a new endeavor. Approximately 130 stakeholders and partners have been involved in this process by participating in both large and small workgroups. The small workgroups were based on those populations that have higher rates of suicide with the construction industry being one of them. Please join us to learn more about the ASIPP development including the results of the construction industry work group.
