This seminar will cover the basic aspects to get started with the University of Michigan 3D Static Strength Prediction Program™ (3DSSPP), available through the University of Michigan Center for Ergonomics. This powerful software can be used to assess ergonomic risk for a range of manual material handling activities. This training will provide an overview of when 3DSSPP may be beneficial in field ergonomics, how to read the main status panel of inputs and results, and how to customize anthropometry, specify preset postures, and enter detailed poses.
