Evaluating and Communicating Program Performance

Most industrial hygiene programs and their results are not effectively shared with workers and management. This has contributed to staff downsizing and budget cuts for many IH programs. Discuss several practical steps and methodologies to establish better two-way communications with key stakeholders so they recognize the value IH brings to the organization.

Motion 2: Governance Change (Dissolving the House of Delegates Position)

The House of Delegates approves the revised ASSP bylaws, ASSP Revised Bylaws January 28, 2022, enacting the governance changes approved by the Board of Directors.


